Safety Tips when Going Away

- Turn down phone ringers or set your voicemail/answering machine to answer after one to two rings
- Set up a timed lighting system
- Place alarm company signs and stickers in plain sight throughout your property to discourage trespassers or thieves

The following are responses from the candidates to questions asked by the NAACP and one question asked to the 1st Ward Candidates submitted by an audience member.

1. What do you see are the 3 top priorities in the City of Lansing?

At-Large Candidates

Carol Wood: Quality of Life, Jobs, Safe Viable Neighborhoods Derrick Quinney: Police/Fire Safety, Regionalism, Job Creation Tom Stewart: Job Growth, Parks and Recreation, Regionalism John Krohn: Housing, Quality of Life, Jobs, Safe Neighborhoods

Rory Nuener: Reform City Council business, Preserve Public Safety, Economic Development

Harold Lehman: Budget (Police and Fire), Growth in City and Region Joe Manzella: Accountability and Transparency, Education, Jobs,
